

In the staging of the play, they stick to the script. It starts it with Langston Hughes' citation. Before every scene, they read all the stage directions like news, temperature and dates to audience. These stage directions, before the scenes, are read by different voices through the play. In act one, scene one and Langston Hughes' citation, are read by a woman's voice, then a man read the others until act two, scene six and seven. Also, there are music in some of opening of the scenes and end of the scenes which Nottage wrote in the script. However, they add music in some scene's end, even Nottage did not write about it. Through the play, sounds were designed by Mason Satnick. In addition, set of the play was full detailed. For example, in the parole office they use a white background, a table and chairs. What's more is they make a great bar with all details.

Actors and actresses performed great. Their characters are perfectly fit. All of their colors and ages are exact in the play. Also, they did Jason's tattoos and black eye through the scenes. In every scene their clothes are different, it says that different days. In addition, there are overlapping dialogues in the play, as it is in the script. So, they really care about all the details. For instance, Stan limps, it is not written in the stage direction, he says that it one of his dialogues, happened in the Olstead.
